From the Headmaster

I wish to express my gratitude to the St. Thomas Library Committee for their recent efforts to increase the quality and support that our collection provides to our students and classical curriculum. Our thanks to those of you who have already supported this work by contributing a book from our St. Thomas Library Wish List (see details below.) To begin this work the committee crafted the following Library Mission Statement:

The mission of the St. Thomas School Library is to encourage the reading of books that are good, true, and beautiful in order to root our students in the classical traditions of Western Civilization and the richness of our Catholic faith.

The written word is a profound reality flowing out of The Word Himself and proceeding all the way to the dusty shelf of a library where a child reaches out to pick up a book, open its pages, and encounters the power and beauty of meaning. We seek to help our students experience a book as an invitation to something larger than themselves—not just a means to an end as much of technology driven reading has become, but as an encounter of their hearts and minds with the true, the good and the beautiful.

To help our students experience the awesome mystery of reading a good book we are transforming the current library room into a special reading room space. Along with the development of our collection with our classical curriculum and reading lists, the current fluorescent lighting is being replaced by track lighting providing a setting with soft illumination and comfortable reading chairs (donations welcome~!) and nooks, together providing an environment of serenity, focus and discovery.

Our thanks again to our library committee and to our entire school community for the support of this effort to help children understand and experience the power of reading a book.

4th – 8th Grade Physical Education English Country Dance Unit

As a portion of instruction in our Physical Education Curriculum summarized below, beginning this Friday for a total of four weeks, Mr. Miller will be supervising the visit of representatives from the **Ann Arbor Community for Traditional Music and Dance** to introduce and train our 4th through 8th graders in the elegance, movement and manner of English Country Dance. This four week unit is part of our six unit Physical Education Curriculum, focusing on the two areas of Coordination and Movement. Students will meet in the parish hall and be guided in the order, sequence and rhythm of this form of group dance with live keyboard and violin accompaniment.
