

School at Home Update

- In conjunction with diocesan recommendations, the St. Thomas the Apostle school 2019-2020 school year will formally end on **Friday, May 29**th. Online classes will be conducted for the last time from Tuesday after Memorial Day to that Friday.
- The remaining seven week period will comprise our final, **Boniface Term** of the school year. We are strategically adjusting our curricular content and focus, given both the shortened period of the term and the less efficient online learning format. Teachers will monitor student attendance, participation and progress through the seven week period in each subject taught. Our goal will be to provide an appropriate next step in our students' learning based upon that of the last three terms, while engaging students in the key concepts and skills with which we look to have our students begin the 2020-2021 school year.
- Access the <u>St. Thomas General Video Lesson Schedule</u> by going to your Google Drive—all parents have been given permission to access the file. (We are discovering that there may be difficulties if you are trying to access the file directly from an email link. If you do not have a google account, and the email link is not allowing you access, request to have it shared with you and I will do so.)
- The St. Thomas School Classroom Portal (or Upper School Google Classroom) will remain
 the location of all planned learning activities, assignments and resources. Link locations for
 online live or recorded zoom lessons will be provided on the website and/or in emails
 provided directly to parents on a weekly basis.
- Zoom Meeting Student Guidelines:
 - 1. Be prepared to start the meeting on time in an appropriate learning setting.
 - 2. Once accepted into the meeting from the waiting room, students must remain muted while waiting for class to start.
 - 3. Cameras on and mics muted until teacher unmutes.
 - 4. Free from distractions in the back ground.
 - 5. Eat before or after zoom meetings.
 - 6. Use the chat feature only to ask the teacher questions.
 - 7. Represent yourself in a positive, Christ like way

Scholastica Term Report Card Online Access
