Continuing Our Students' Learning

- During this period of closure we continue to fulfill our responsibilities to guide the ongoing trajectory of learning and development of your children while they are at home. All St. Thomas teachers are providing regular updates to parents via email and their website classroom portal with specific activities and assignments. All students are expected to complete this work during the period of closure according to provided due dates. Upon our return from school, learning will continue from the point at which this distance learning leaves off. Grades may be generated for assignments per teacher assignment information.
- As we all learn to best leverage our e-communication tools and skills, we seek to provide our students with ongoing learning support and direction. Thank you for your patience in this process. Please feel welcome to contact teachers during their stated 'office hours' when they will immediately respond to emails, or be able to call you to discuss needs. Please explain any problems, limitations, etc. which we will seek to resolve quickly. We look to be able to clearly and efficiently communicate our distance learning activities and make them beneficial to our students continued progress in learning.
- Please note that teachers will be providing these activities and assignments in steps. There may be a desire on the part of students to have 'all the work at once' in order to complete it as soon as possible. Pedagogically this does not serve students understanding, retention and quality of work. Teachers will therefore be providing assignments on a daily basis or in increments of a few days.
- We are grateful for the key role our parents will play in this process in receiving emails, visiting our school website, printing materials when necessary, monitoring student web usage, administering and possibly correcting a quiz, or sending in an assignment as directed by the teacher. We are grateful for this collaboration and look to work closely with both our parents and students in making this time a continuation of our classical Catholic education at St. Thomas.
