
October is the Month of the Rosary

From the Headmaster

On Friday the Michigan Supreme Court ruled that the legal basis of the State of Emergency under which Governor Whitmer exercised the authority to issue executive orders related to the coronavirus pandemic was not constitutional. Yesterday Attorney General Dana Nessel announced that the orders issued after April 30 would not be enforced. Currently, county health departments are reviewing the status of these orders and the role that they may play in defining their continuation. In the meantime, the state legislature and the governor have offered to work together in defining a statewide coronavirus response plan that is approved by both the executive and legislative branches of the state government.

In order to support the continued health and safety of our school community, St. Thomas will continue to practice the protocols and procedures as outlined in our St. Thomas Reopening Plan issued in July (attached). The executive order requiring masks to be worn all day by Kindergarten through 4th grade students that was to be effective today, Monday, October 5th, is currently on hold pending further information from the local health department. For the time being, as stated in the Reopening Plan, Kindergarten through 4th grade students will be required to wear makes in all transitions to and from the school, to, from and during all specials classes, and to and from the cafeteria. Masks for Kindergarten through 4th grade students in their homeroom while at their desks during school day instruction are optional.


