Quick Reminders:

• COVID Precautions/Procedures:

- Please ensure your child comes to school each morning with a **water bottle** as all drinking fountains have been converted to bottle filling stations.
- All students are to wear a mask for entering, leaving and transitioning within the school building per the State of Michigan and Diocesan adopted school reopening requirements.
- Please ensure your child's temperature is below 100.4 degrees before considering sending them to school each day.

School Reopening Plan Update:

Per Governor Whitmer's recent <u>Executive Order #185</u>, beginning next Monday, October 5th, students in grades Kindergarten through 4th grade will be required to wear their facial covering in the classroom during the school day, except during outdoor recess and lunch.

What Can You Do to Support Their Child's Progress in Learning?

In our partnership for your student's success at St. Thomas, we look to parents to provide these keys supports to their progress:

- 3rd 8thg Grade: Confirm your child's knowledge and completion of all assigned homework. Their planning is to come home daily and come back to school each morning. Parents may also check the classroom web portal for assignments.
- Provide practice at home in learning math facts, practicing spelling/vocabulary words, etc.
- Have student read to you—this includes older students as well!
- **Read to your children**—including your upper school students! <u>Hearing text/prose at a higher level than they themselves can read being read to them is one of the most powerful means of developing a child's reading and writing abilities</u>—as well as providing a wonderful setting for a family or parent-child time together!
