• Registration packets for current families are being sent home today.

- \$150 registration fee will be credited to tuition if submitted by Thursday, March 11<sup>th</sup>.
- Current enrollment seating for the next grade will be reserved only through Thursday, March 11<sup>th</sup>. Newly enrolling families' registrations will be accepted for any open seats beginning Friday, March 12<sup>th</sup>.
- Class size limit ~ Kindergarten Eight Grade: 16
- Classroom Model: Single grade classrooms: K, 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>. Combined grade classroom: 6<sup>th</sup>/7<sup>th</sup> [Pending enrollment count]
- Projected 2021-2022 Enrollment: Preschool~35 students, Kindergarten 8th Grade~100 students.

### Beginning Scholastica Term~ What Can You Do?

As we begin this third term of the school year, we renew our partnership for your student's success at St. Thomas. Parents can provide these keys supports to their children's progress:

- 3<sup>rd</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> Grade: **Confirm your child's completion of all assigned homework.** Their planner is to come home daily and come back to school each morning. Parents may also check the classroom web portal for assignments.
- Provide **practice at home** in learning math facts, practicing spelling/vocabulary words, etc.
- Have your child read to you—this includes older students as well!
- **Read to your children**—including your upper school students! <u>Hearing text/prose at a higher level than they themselves can read being read to them is one of the most powerful means of developing a child's reading and writing abilities</u>—as well as providing a wonderful setting for a family or parent-child time together!
