How Did This Happen So Fast?

For many the propagation of the ideology that gender was a matter of choice and not necessarily determined naturally, or that we are not bound by any natural biological gender identity, has overtaken the social and political narrative in the United States with surprising speed. 2021-2022 Enrollment Registration ~ We encourage all our currently enrolled families to reserve their seat for the new school year by submitting their enrollment materials by **March 11th**.
