


From the Headmaster

St. Thomas Enrollment Update \sim Thank you for the timely return of your 2021-2022 registration materials as we plan in earnest for the upcoming school year. Presently in Kindgarten through Eighth Grade we have 103 students registered. With currently anticipated registrations, actual enrollment at the start of school year is expected to be at least 110 students. Our enrollment history as a classical school is below.






