

### From the Headmaster

**2020-2021 Parent Survey**  $\sim$  Each year we reach out to parents to obtain vital information on our progress as a school-- classroom by classroom and the school setting as a whole. We again ask your input on our annual survey which provides an anonymous and focus means to communication you and your child(ren)'s experience at St. Thomas. The survey consists of 1) five questions regarding the classroom environment, 2) six questions concerning the schoolwide setting, and 3) three open ended questions seeking your input. We ask *every family* to participate in this key activity that constitutes a vital responsibility in our partnership.

**Current COVID-19 Status** ~ We renew our expression of appreciation for our entire community's diligence in implementing our St. Thomas School Re-Opening Plan protocols that have allowed us to open and continue with in-person instruction these past eight months.

The current surge in case numbers are approaching those of last fall in Michigan and Washtenaw county, fortunately the hospitalization and mortality rates are much lower. The most recent data from the Washtenaw Department of Health is provided below. The very large majority of current cases remain in the young adult to mature adult

group. However, our vigilance in monitoring our children's temperature and display of any symptoms remains critical to our being able to avoid any potential spread within the school setting—thank you for your collaboration in carrying out our protocols. I attach a FAQ for Parents in regard to quarantining and provide below a reminder of the profile we are using to track potential COVID symptoms. If you have any particular questions RE your child's health, please call your pediatrician for clarification of your child's health status.

### **SYMPTOMS PROFILE:**

<u>High Risk Symptoms</u>~

- Fever--temperature 100.4 F or higher/chills/body aches
- Cough--new onset or worsening
- Shortness of breath/difficulty breathing
- Change in ability to taste or smell


If demonstrating any **one or more** high risk symptoms, isolate individual and seek medical evaluation. Notify school.

### Lower Risk Symptoms~

- Headache
- Sore Throat
- Nausea/Vomiting/Diarrhea
- Congestion/Runny Nose
- Fatigue


If yes to **one** of the lower risk symptoms stay at home and monitor for resolution or development of additional symptoms. If yes to **two or more** of the lower risk symptoms isolate symptomatic individual and seek medical evaluation. Notify school.

### New COVID-19 Hospital Admissions by Age Group in Washtenaw County Residents (by Admit Week)\* (as of 4/9)


Washtenaw County (N = 1274)
