St. Thomas Classical Curriculum Resource Update

As we continue to implement and evaluate our curricular resources used to support the instruction of our classical curriculum, we have each year looked to see where improvements may be made in the resources we use in our classical instruction. To this end, we have reviewed our Saxon Math text series in grades K through 6th, our Abeka grammar series in grades 3 and 4 with our IEW grammar program in 5th through 8th. Teachers have reviewed we have determined that it will be a significant benefit to our students to adopt the Dimensions Math Program produced by Singapore Math in Kindergarten through 6th grade, and the Well-Ordered Language Program published by Classical Academic Press for use in 3rd through 8th grade.

DIMENSIONS MATH: This curricular resource provides instruction in the conceptual background to the procedural content of mathematics which will allow students to gain a deeper understanding and more

intuitive grasp of the procedural, skill based aspects of mathematics. Aligned with our classical approach to learning, students will be able to see the underlying concepts of the problem solving methods and procedures, thereby offering a richer experience of math and avoiding a superficial and disengaging emphasis on mathematical practices.

WELL-ORDERED LANGUAGE: Similarly, this program offers a deeper exposure to the organization and structure of the English language as an end in itself, moving beyond the functional role of linguistic parts, and developing a vantage point to not only use the language but to understand its use. In light of our classical understanding of learning, the value of this understanding of language significant, and will open doors in our students minds to the beauty, power and structure of language.

Dress Code Policy 2021-2022

As our school grows with new students joining our community, our school culture and climate become an important focus with our dress code serving as a significant contributor to the socio-emotional climate our students experience in school. With new students entering at all grades, at the start of our school year we will be placing a special emphasis on compliance with our dress code policy (attached). This gives us all an opportunity to review the dress code and ensure we are fulfilling its standards. Please pay special attention to shoes, socks, belts. Note that 5th grade is an Upper School class and will follow the Upper School Dress Code.

Shoes: Solid black/dark toned shoes. K – 8 girls may wear all white sneakers or flats with foot covering. PE Class Only: Tennis shoes. Boots, sandals, clogs, roller shoes, high heels, platform or shoes with logos are not dress code compliant. All shoes must have backs and toes, and be tied at all times.

Socks: Solid white or dark color crew socks. Solid color knee socks, leggings or tights in white, black, hunter green (lower school girls only) or navy (upper school girls only).

General: Belt looped pants must be worn with a brown or black belt with metal buckle only. All shirts and blouses must be tucked into pants or skirts. One pair post earrings, girls only. Polish/Make-up: None for lower school, minimal for upper school girls. No distracting haircuts, unnatural colors or styles. Jewelry: Minimal. No hats. Headmaster reserves the right to make final decisions in regard to interpreting and applying the dress code.

Non-Compliance Procedure: AM Homeroom Dress Code Check—A student not dress code compliant will call home from the office to have dress code wear brought to school. Students are re-admitted to the classroom only after being dress code compliant.
