Measures of Academic Progress Fall Assessment Begin

This week our Kindergarten through 4th grade students, and our 5th through 8th grade students next week, will take their annual Fall nationally standardized Reading, Mathematics and, this year, Grammar assessments. Please see teacher portal pages for specific schedules. This assessment is a tool that allows teachers and parents to understand our students' progress with respect to a nationwide norm group. These results allow us to both determine, as well as any assessment tool can, the current level of achievement with respect to a grade, season and subject national norm, and the growth our students achieve from Fall to Winter and from Fall to Spring, again with respect to a national norms of growth. While the deeper qualities of student achievement at St. Thomas include imagination, wonder, curiosity and moral judgement—this tool does allow

us to see the power of the subject based critical thinking skills our students attain. We will share these results with you at conferences and track with you your student's Winter and Spring growth through the school year ahead.
