From the Headmaster

Curriculum Update~

As planned when we made our transition to classical learning at St. Thomas, we have continued to evaluate the effectiveness of our curricular resources in their serving to meet the primary goals of our classical Catholic curriculum. At the heart of our curricular goals is equipping children to think—to move beyond a less conscious, 'programmed' response to circumstances and instead be able to ask key questions, seek insight, identify what is most important, and to evaluate evidence. The capacity to think versus react to the world around us is that 'liberality' or freedom expressed in the phrase 'Catholic liberal education', to which classical Catholic education is commonly referred.

This year we have made significant improvements in our grammar and mathematics tools used to support students—to lead them in understanding and using more deeply the language of English and the language of Mathematics. In both cases, our previous tools prompted a less conceptual, procedural use of both English and Math. Our new grammar program – *Well Ordered Language* published by Classical Academic Press, and our new mathematics program -- *Dimensions Math*, published by Singapore Math, are providing our students with the vantage point of a deeper understanding and utility in the skills, structure and application of English and Math, allowing them to both appreciate and use these languages at a more proficient and effective level. Both of these programs are being used in other classical settings--both recommended by Hillsdale College's Blaney Initiative for classical education.

Teachers are implementing these two new tools with an awareness that they will involve a transition for our students in moving from more simplistic expectations to a deeper grasp of both grammar and mathematics. This is obviously a natural passage as students are both challenged by and supported in being able to function at a more proficient level. Unfamiliarity will be a natural experience as students grow fluent in the fuller understanding that both these tools afford. For example, knowing and recognizing linguistic patterns and structures of speech in the diagramming of sentences. Or,

developing as early as $3^{\rm rd}$ grade algebraic intuition and strategy in solving story problems. These more conceptual understandings all the while being supported by the memorization of key grammatical parts of speech (with jingles!) and all multiplication and division math facts by $3^{\rm rd}$ grade.

As they use these tools for the first time, teachers will be patient with students, monitoring their assimilation of the new approaches, and provide guided assistance in initial lesson instruction, support in exercises, additional help and adjusted pacing as needed. We will also avoid measuring both our students' progress and the fruit of their efforts with a previous standard of ease and ability. Ease, of course, is not an indicator of quality of understanding and application. We will provide students encouragement when they do not have an immediate, recalled response to questions and problems--a very healthy experience of challenge in which we want them to be remain confident and through which they can experience the deeper quality and power of their thinking.
