St. Thomas Classroom Air Conditioners

With late August's high temperature days, we are all aware of the very uncomfortable heat our teachers and students experience. To provide an environment where students and teachers can be at their best through the school day and through our first and last warm weeks of our school year, funds have been procured allowing us to purchase portable room air conditioners. Mechanical work to be done in a window casement in each classroom will provide a vent for the unit to exhaust its heat output to the outdoors. While we are unlikely to have the units installed before our current warm weather, we will look ahead to a cool weeks of learning in May and June in our classrooms!
