

### From the Headmaster

As modern society continues on its course it becomes obvious, as Pope Emeritus Benedict described:

"The real problem at this moment of our history is that God is disappearing from the human horizon, and, with the dimming of the light which comes from God, humanity is losing its bearings, with increasingly evident destructive effects."

A significant example of this dimming of the light and loss of bearings is the increasingly pervasive and vocal narrative that gender is a personal choice, an option within a spectrum of personal identity choices that an individual has the power to discard, change and adapt. The only clear voice communicating truth and health and hope in our day is the Catholic Church's teaching of an anthropology grounded in our being created *by a Creator*, and created in the image and likeness of that Creator. In this originating act we are given a nature--inviolable and determined by a power and glory transcending any act or power of human freedom.

In this nature is our personal home, our identity, peace, and potentials. In our day, the age old effort of the human will to shirk all restraint and limits, even of our own nature, is being confronted and contained by the Church's teaching on the Theology of the Body and its implications for the issues of sexual identity. St. Thomas School is offering a unique

opportunity to grow in our personal grasp of these implications and our being able to use them in defending our children, our families and community and keeping their light from dimming in the present darkness. Join us for our upcoming presentation by Dr. Mary Healy.

#### Making Payments to St. Thomas School

Last school year we adopted the e-Funds online payment method to facilitate the payment of lunch orders, athletics fees, fund raising contributions, special event payments, field trip costs, ESP charges, etc. There is a fee charged by the eFunds platform, which, when the payment amount is small, can be a unreasonable percentage of the payment. We therefore recommend that you accumulate charges (not to exceed a month) and note the following fee schedule:

## **Electronic Funds Transfer from Checking Account:** \$1.25 for any amount **Credit Card Charge:** 3%

We are also now again allowing checks to be written out to *St. Thomas School* and turned into the school office for any payments made for school expenses.

#### **COVID Procedures Reminder**

Please find below the symptom profiles we use, as recommended by the Michigan Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, to determine potential COVID infections. We require a negative result of at least the at-home antigen test (or the lab PCR test) before a child is able to return to school if they have either one high risk symptom or two low risk symptoms. We are all grateful for our parents' collaboration in ensuring the health and safety of the school community.

#### High Risk Symptoms∼

- Fever--temperature 100.4 F or higher/chills/body aches
- Cough--new onset or worsening
- Shortness of breath/difficulty breathing
- Change in ability to taste or smell

#### Lower Risk Symptoms∼

- Headache
- Sore Throat
- Nausea/Vomiting/Diarrhea
- Congestion/Runny Nose
- Fatigue
