2022-2023 Enrollment Registrations

Please be tracking your plans to complete your 2022-2023 Enrollment Registration. Details are below. Please feel welcome to contact me if you have any questions about enrolling next year.

COVID Update

St. Thomas currently has no active cases of COVID-19. The Washtenaw Department of Health has issued new isolation and quarantine protocols for children in the preschool/childcare setting. Previously, a positive case required 10 day isolation which has been changed to a 5 day isolation with symptom improvement, and the 10 day exposure quarantine has been changed to 10 day/no test, 5 day/test and mask, or stay-at school-with testing options. Details of our protocols and case history are below.

Enrollment for the 2022-2023 School Year

Current families will have been provided enrollment registration materials due March 1st. Registration fees will be credited toward tuition only for those registrations received by March 1st. Beginning March 2nd, enrollment will be open to new family registration with classroom sizes limited to 16 students in Kindergarten and 18 students in 1st through 8th grades.

COVID Update:

The Washtenaw Department of Health has issued **new isolation and quarantine protocols for children in the preschool/childcare setting**, effectively changing a required 10 day positive isolation to a 5 day isolation with symptom improvement, and the 10 day exposure quarantine to the 10 day/no test, 5 day/test and mask, or stay-at schoolwith testing options.

• Positive COVID Case Protocols:

- Isolate at home for at least 5 days after symptom onset: Day 0 is the day symptoms started or test sample was collected.
- On day 5, does case have no symptoms or symptoms are resolving?
 - o If yes, can stop isolation on day 6. *Continue to wear a well-fitting mask around others through day 10.*
 - o If no, should NOT stop isolation continue isolating until symptoms resolve or 10 days have gone by since tested positive or first developed symptoms. If case has a fever, continue to isolate until fever goes away.
 - "Resolving symptoms" means symptoms have gotten noticeably better.
 Some symptoms (like fatigue and loss of smell) may last a longer time

• COVID Exposure Protocols:

- If exposed in a lower-risk school setting no contact tracing is required. This includes most in-school contacts, including classrooms, buses, lunch, and most extra-curricular activities. Individuals should closely monitor symptoms for 10 days.
- If exposed in a higher-risk setting, complete contact tracing and 5 day quarantine per above.
 - Household contacts of a positive case.
 - Outbreaks: if part of outbreak class/group.
- NOTE: High risk exposure is also eligible for the 'Test and Stay' quarantine with 10 day masking and testing based on vaccination status, previous COVID-19 illness (within last 90 days).
