A Note on the Virtues for the Year and for the Term

I have already begun to talk with students about devotion and sacrifice, both of which are aspects of the virtue of religion, the disposition to give God His due. Devotion helps us to remain committed to serving God, particularly in worship. This virtue is central to living out our love and adoration of Jesus. We are focusing in particular on how we can practice this virtue at Mass. Today we talked about having "custody of the eyes." This helps us to focus on what is most important, which, at Mass, is the supreme Sacrifice being offered on the Altar. Keeping our eyes fixed on the Altar and on Jesus in the Eucharist can be a small sacrifice offered to and with Jesus.

Afternoon ESP Starting 9/6

Our afternoon Extended School Program will be starting up again the day we get back from Labor Day break (Tuesday, September 6th). Preschoolers begin at 3:10 and K-9 students begin at 3:25. Please register with Khrista Boes, our bookkeeper,

Jeans Day

School Policies/Reminders

P.E. Clothes

A reminder to parents of 6th-8th graders to pay \$24 for gym clothes. This can be done at the office with cash or check, or on EFunds.

Dress Code Reminders

Please refer to the dress code for policies on shoes, socks, and belts. These three items have been the most frequently violated areas. Boots are not allowed, and shoe height should remain at or below the ankle area. Shoes must be of uniform color – either black or dark-toned, with girls allowed to wear all-white shoes. Socks need to be crew, and thus at or above the ankle bone. Boys need to wear belts. Beginning after Labor Day, we will begin calling home for repeat offenders to have proper wear brought to school.

Lunch Ordering

Hot lunch ordering will begin for the month of October (more details to come). Please note that, this year, the school will not place a lunch order for any student whose parent did not submit an accompanying payment with their order. That will cut down on the confusion and headache surrounding outstanding balances.

Parent Orientation - September 7th, 6:30-8:00 PM

We will be in-person for orientation this year. This will be an opportunity for you to hear about how the school is doing and what we're doing at the school this year, and to check in with teachers. I look forward to seeing you there!

Note on PowerSchool

PowerSchool is the online system that the school uses for grades, assignments, attendance, etc. New families should be receiving a letter this week that will allow them to login to PowerSchool for the first time. Returning families should be able to use their existing login information to access PowerSchool.
