Today at assembly, I talked about the Battle of Agincourt (1415) and read Henry V's famous speech in Shakespeare's play. I urged them to continue using both of these weapons as we near election day on November 8th. We want to be like the soldiers who loyally and bravely fought for their king, winning a great victory, rather than those who left and lost their honor. Besides, as I have been telling them, the prayers of children are especially effective!

First Term Virtue Awards

Each homeroom teacher (K-8) will select one student to be the recipient of the award for sacrifice, the virtue we have been focusing on for the Margaret Mary term. The award recipients will be announced at morning assembly next Monday (10/31 at 8:00 in the parish hall). Parents are welcome to join us that morning. Parents of winning students will be notified beforehand.

We will be honoring 9 students in all, but I have been impressed by all the students' growth so far this year. It has been a great blessing for me to get to know your children, to see their docility, cheerfulness, and friendships. I joke with Mrs. Steffy that we're doing well because we've had no catastrophes and the building's still standing, but I can in all seriousness attest to much more than just that! I believe that we have a real culture of friendship at this school, and I am encouraged by dedication of both teachers and students as we enter our second term.
