Conferences Follow-Up

It was great to be able to see and talk with many of you at conferences last week. I want to thank you for your great dedication to your children and their formation. I see so much evidence of that dedication and formation at school. They are great kids, and that is a testament to all that you've done for them!

Nicholas Term Virtue: Studiousness

I talked to the students this morning about how this virtue is a form of the virtue of temperance. We all naturally desire to know, and in our age of social media and internet surfing, we have habituated ourselves to knowing many things easily and quickly, though not often deeply and fully. This virtue, which moderates our natural desire to know, is opposed to the vice of *curiositas*, which pursues knowledge in a gluttonous sort of way, always seeking to consume more knowledge, not for love of the Truth, but for the love of feeling filled, or for vanity and pride, etc. In the coming weeks, we will be talking about what this practically might mean, particularly in light of the way in which "the knowledge of good and evil" was part of the original temptation that led to the Fall.

Martinmas and Veterans' Day

This Friday, we will be celebrating the feast of St. Martin of Tours, soldier-turned-monk-and-bishop. The day also marks the $104^{\rm th}$ anniversary of the armistice that ended the fighting in World War I. This morning, I talked to the students about both commemorations, a fitting coincidence that shows yet another way in which the Faith can shed further light on great world events.
