Diocesan Plan for Schools

Next Wednesday at a meeting in Lansing, the Institute for Catholic Liberal Education (ICLE) will introduce principals to a Catholic Liberal Arts vision. This is part of a diocese-wide effort to transition all diocesan schools towards a liberal arts' focus by having schools work with ICLE, whose conferences our teachers have attended in past years. Obviously, St. Thomas is already centered on the liberal arts, so we are ahead of the curve on this one! This, I think, confirms once more that the bishop really wants a classical/liberal arts education to be available all over his diocese, and that the model of tacking on religious instruction to an otherwise conventional public-school style of education is neither integrally Catholic nor ultimately meaningful.
