I am currently in the process of interviewing and vetting potential tutors for the school, particularly in the subject areas of Math (grades 1-9) and Latin (grades 5-9). Once I have a group together who have turned in their Virtus training certificate and finger-printing, I will be sending out their contact information and we would be happy to help you get connected with a tutor that could help your child. From there, parents can arrange directly with tutors the time and place. Parents will also set up a mutually agreeable compensation.
