Classical Catholic Education Summary and Reading List

Back in the fall, I wrote a series in the newsletters about various terms and meanings used in classical Catholic education. I know that parents sometimes wonder what exactly this "classical education" really is, especially since most of you probably didn't receive such an education yourselves. For those have the time and the will, hopefully this can be a helpful aide in developing your understanding of it. I will say that the "classical education" movement is a recent phenomenon, and there is a lot of messiness and fuzziness surrounding it. In a sense, we are all trying to catch up to what this thing is, because we all, in one way or another, are significantly impacted by modern, conventional education. I believe that a starting point of fundamental importance is in history – knowing what classical education and the liberal arts are, not just as they've been revived in the last 20 years, but as they've developed over centuries in Western culture.
