
A Busy Week Ahead – From the Headmaster

Classical Learning Test (CLT)

With support from the diocese, I volunteered our school to pilot the newly developed CLT for grades 3-6. Additionally, I signed up our 7th-8th graders to take the CLT-8, designed for 7th-8th graders. This test was created as an alternative standardized assessment for classical schools, and the originally CLT, taken by 11th-12th graders, is increasingly being recognized and accepted by colleges and universities. We will not only be looking at how we do, but also at the usefulness of a test like this for future school years, including the upper (high) school.
