Some of you will be contacted individually by teachers about your son or daughter needing to do some extra work this summer to be ready for next school year. Please look for those communications (if they haven't already been sent) via email sometime this week.

Additionally, I gave all of the students at assembly some summer homework. First, I asked them to pick a consistent time every day to pray. Second, I asked that they try to read at least five good books over the summer. Dates to Note for August

Please note the following dates as we look ahead to the beginning of next school year:

- In-service for teachers begins the week of August 14th; the school office will be open the week prior, beginning on August 7th.
- All teachers and staff will be participating in an Active Shooter Training offered by the Washtenaw County Sheriff's Department on August 16th as part of the school's efforts to update its safety procedures, navigate a tricky building setup, and better coordinate with the parish in response to potential threats. I have been through this training 3 times, and I have found it effective in helping teachers think realistically about various scenarios and their potential responses to them.
- Our back-to-school picnic is currently scheduled for August 18th from 4 to 7 p.m. at Southeast Area Park.
- First day of school is a half day on August 22nd!
