

From the Headmaster

It was a great joy to welcome the students back last week. If you haven't already, check out the great <u>video</u> produced and published by the diocese last week featuring our school! Thank you for entrusting your children to St. Thomas. As we pursue what is most worthwhile together, I commend us all to the Blessed Mother, placing this school year in her hands. I also pray today for the intercession of St. Augustine, that the students will be led more deeply into Truth Himself.

I have been very impressed with the students' discipline and cheerfulness during these first days of school. I feel that, for those returning, they've hardly missed a beat, and for those who are new, they are quickly joining in with what the rest of the students are doing. For example, on the first day, we all had to wait patiently for the Kindergarten, who understandably took a little longer to make it to the parish hall

for assembly. The students' quiet and discipline impressed the videographer, who confessed he'd never seen such an orderly school, especially on the first day! That's a testament to the students themselves, to your continued parenting at home, and to the teachers' immediate influence in establishing a contemplative and cheerful school culture.

As a note, parents are always more than welcome to attend all-school assemblies and Masses. If there ever are assemblies where we need to address students without parents, we'll be sure to let the parents there know.

Though our day off last Friday was an unexpected interruption, the 9th-10th grade boys still had the opportunity to attend their opening-of-the-year retreat at the Tar Paper Shack with Mr. McCoy and Mr. Lennon, our new Latin teacher. The boys had a great time immersing themselves in the basic story of the Faith and bonding with each other to set the year off on the right foot!

This Thursday, the middle and upper school students will have a chance to meet and listen to Dom Chrysostom Maria, a monk from Silverstream Abbey in Ireland on a home visit. He is my good friend of many years and a former teacher at St. Augustine's. He'll be talking to the students about the monastic life and I'm sure add plenty of insights on the Christian life! Parents are welcome to join too – we'll be in the school library after Mass.

School Texting Communication

Last Friday, I used our mass texting service to announce the school closure. I have since updated the list to include all new families as well. **Tomorrow, Tuesday, I will be sending out a test text around 2 p.m. to ensure that everyone is receiving it. It will come from the number 844-575-7393**. I will be sure to identify the school and/or myself in the message. Dress Code Notes

Thank you for your cooperation in purchasing proper shoe ware! I want to clarify/reiterate a couple of things:

- Boys should wear only blue or black crew socks. Girls may wear white crew socks, along with the other options listed in the dress code. Socks, which must be worn, must at least cover the ankle bone.
- Even if they are otherwise dress-code compliant, shoes should not come past the ankle bone in height.

We had a day off instead of a dress-down day. Our next special dress day will be Wednesday, September 6th, which will be a mandatory dress-up day.
