From the Headmaster

We have had lots to talk about at assemblies of late. Our virtue for the year is faith, one of the three "theological virtues" that we receive at baptism. I have emphasized that faith is a gift, something not earned but received through a working of grace with which we cooperate. I have also pointed out the important connection between faith and truth. To believe is not merely to have an experience of changed convictions or life goals, but an assent of the mind, moved by the will through grace, to revealed truths, including mysteries that we cannot fully comprehend. This assent is a special gift of grace enabling our intellect to hold with supernatural firmness and certainty to revealed Truth, Who is Christ Himself (see CCC 153-158). This is why teaching the Catholic Faith well is so critical. Questions of culpability aside, simply teaching in a misleading or erroneous way can damage faith if it causes someone to hold to a falsehood, to hold to a "false Christ." We call the gift of faith a virtue, and, as with other virtues, it can grow through our practice of it. I relayed to students one simple way to grow in the virtue of faith: pray an act of faith. A traditional act of faith, such as the following, also provides further material for catechesis, which we will be exploring in coming weeks:

O my God, I firmly believe that you are one God in three divine Persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. I believe that your divine Son became man and died for our sins and that he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe these and all the truths which the Holy Catholic Church teaches because you have revealed them who are eternal truth and wisdom, who can neither deceive nor be deceived. In this faith I intend to live and die. Amen.


Today we continued to work through a video of the EF Mass to help prepare students for our first EF school Mass on October 6th. We are noticing the obvious similarities between the two forms of the Mass, as well as the aspects of the EF Mass that will feel or sound different. One point of emphasis in speaking to the students about their participation at either form of the Mass is that they should seek to unite their hearts and minds to the basic action of the Mass, which is the offering of perfect worship and love to the Father in, with, and through Christ. During the parts of the EF Mass when it is more difficult to know "what is happening," students can always return to that most fundamental and important aspect of their participation and prayer. As we continue to work on our bodily postures at Mass, we will also continue to emphasize the way in which our outward acts are naturally tied to our interior disposition.

You may have noticed my St. Thomas bulletin entry this past weekend. As we continue to work to strengthen ties between the parish and school, I plan to write a column every month to keep the parish informed about the school, both to highlight school events and to continue to clarify our identity and mission as a classical Catholic school.
