From the Headmaster

We enjoyed a couple of performances at assembly today, and we look forward to upcoming ones as well. Our 2^{nd} graders did a wonderful job acting out, in costume, the Parable of the Good Samaritan. As our 2^{nd} - 10^{th} graders use their Bibles more and more this year, we hope to continue to make our curriculum and school culture

more permeated with Scripture! I followed up with a reading of G.K. Chesterton's "Lepanto," commemorating the 1571 naval battle of that name. At the October 30^{th} assembly, winning 5^{th} - 10^{th} -grade boys from each class will recite, for a grand prize, the famous speech from Shakespeare's *Henry V* in commemoration of St. Crispin's Day. At the assembly on November 6^{th} , winning 5^{th} - 8^{th} -grade girls will recite, for a grand prize, John McCrae's "In Flanders Fields" in commemoration of Veterans' Day.

Today at assembly I also reminded the students about the importance of the rosary and of carrying one with them. I asked all the students to pray a rosary this week for our school and for the Church. The rosary is a powerful weapon in our Christian battle!

New Date - Art and Poetry, Choir Concert / Choir Update

We had originally scheduled our art and poetry night in mid-November and our choir concert in mid-December. Both of these dates have been removed from the calendar. There is now only one evening scheduled, combining art, poetry, drama, and music, on December 12th from 6:30-8:00 p.m. Not only will this cut down on commitments during an already-busy time of year, but it also accommodates the fact that we currently do not have a teacher to replace our current long-term substitute, Mrs. Setterholm, who will only be with us through the end of the first term. I have had a number of leads of the summer and into September, but all of them have fallen through for one reason or another. As we pray we find someone to continue choral music class at the school, something that is an integral part of our classical curriculum, I am working with the faculty to come up with a "plan B."
