From the Headmaster

As you may have heard, Father Bill and Father Gerald announced the establishment of an endowment for the school, with an initial investment, from an anonymous donor, of \$500,000! This endowment is specifically set up to supplement available funds for teacher salaries, which are much lower than those offered in public schools. We hope to continue to grow this fund, through further donations, so as to

provide a significant annual fund for offering competitive salaries to maintain and bring in excellent teachers. You can see this past weekend's bulletin for Father Bill's announcement to the parish.

As noted in the calendar above, we plan to "go live" for online registration through FACTS on Monday, January 8th. The registration deadline for returning families will be February 5th, after which time we will accept all families on a first-come, first-served basis. When we do go live, we will be sure to specially announce the fact in multiple ways (newsletter, email, website), along with specific directions as needed.

There are a couple of other calendar notes for January as well. First, to avoid extra stress on the first day back, our dress-up day will be moved to the second Wednesday of the month, January 10th. Second, our all-school open house is schedule for MLK day, January 15th, which is a half day. As we did last year, we will invite families to tour the school and see it in action between 9:00 and 11:00 that morning.
