From the Headmaster

As we turn our attention to the holiest week of the year, know that I will be keeping you all in my prayers. This is truly a time of great grace for the Church, as she joins with Christ in His passion, death, and resurrection.

Back in the fall, I mentioned our intentions to update our emergency plans. This is something that I meant to have completed sooner, but that didn't go according to

plan! The plans are now updated, based on input from both school and parish side. The chief area of focus was the section pertaining to our emergency response to a physical threat on campus. We have already adapted the way we have run our drills so as to emphasize the fluidity and live decision-making that will mark this kind of event. Protecting our students is based on the following main areas of focus: door security, live information and communication, and active, ongoing localized responses in light of known circumstances. The plans are not a public document for security reasons; however, I would be more than happy to sit down and discuss further with any interested parent. We take this issue seriously and will continue to reflect on how we can best face the challenge presented by a potential physical threat, commending all to Our Lady's care.

Over a month ago, our 9th and 10th graders took the 9/10 level Classical Learning Test (CLT-10). We recently received the results. Collectively, on a test with a score total of 120, they scored an average of over 13 points higher than the average score from students nationwide, which, I believe, is a testament to the impact of our upper-school formation, even in the short-term!

Solar Eclipse – April 8th

Our area of Michigan will experience a partial eclipse from just before 2 p.m. to around 4:30 p.m. on Monday, April 8th. Right around dismissal will be the time nearest "totality," when we will experience a 99% eclipse. We will be sure to instruct the students on avoiding looking directly at the sun, which can cause eye damage during a partial eclipse.
