## From the Headmaster

In honor of Reading Month, I used assembly time today to read the students a story from a favorite collection of folk stories: Howard Pyle's *Salt and Pepper*. This would be a wonderful month to read out loud with your kids! That is something that is central to the classical approach for all levels, including high school. Reading out loud brings out the delight and beauty of the words, the tone, and the "music" of a piece of writing. It also engages the kids in the art of listening. Feel free to reach out to your child's classroom or literature teacher for good read-aloud suggestions. I am also attaching my "headmaster's list" for ideas.

I look forward to seeing you tomorrow evening at our evening discussion on technology use at home. This will provide parents an opportunity to share ideas and listen to insights on how to have a disciplined and limited approach to screentime at home, particularly in light of the mission of the school and a Catholic vision of human development. This is about crafting a positive approach to a pressing issue, rather than just a reactionary approach.

This Wednesday, the full-time teachers and I will be attending our second in-person professional development session with ICLE (Institute of Catholic Liberal Education). We will be joining our sister schools St. Mary's in Williamston and Resurrection in Lansing. This will be a great opportunity for our staff to deepen their love of and reflection on classical Catholic education.
