


Choir Concert

In the Extraordinary Form calendar, this week is the Octave of Pentecost, which provides us with a powerful way to continue to meditate on the great gift of the Holy Spirit. In fact, at his ad limina trip to Rome 5 years ago, Bishop Boyea made a special <u>request</u> to the pope for its restoration to the calendar. In honor of our bishop's desire, even though we have officially begun Ordinary Time, we'll continue to sing the Regina Caeli through this week, as was traditionally done. We'll also be praying selected lines from the Pentecost Sequence at our all-school end-of-day prayers, especially since the sequence is sung or said at all the Masses of the octave. Additionally, our all-school EF Mass this Friday will be part of that octave, for which our schola will chant a simple sung Mass, including the Pentecost Sequence.
