From the Headmaster

Last week, the full-time teachers, Mr. McCoy, and I participated in a two-day workshop with the Institute of Catholic Liberal Education (ICLE) on mimetic instruction. This is year II for the diocese in the three-year process of working with the ICLE to shift schools towards a liberal arts' focus. We are clustered with the two other schools in the diocese that have already committed to this direction: St. Mary's in Williamston and Resurrection in Lansing. It is always a time of good conversation and comradery when our faculties get together, and last week was no exception! Teachers had an opportunity to watch each other give short lessons and give feedback, as well as participate in sample lessons to demonstrate various approaches to having students practice imitating and applying what they imitate. It was a fruitful time for us to continue to reflect on classical education, as well as a chance for our teachers to demonstrate the depth of their knowledge and their engagement with the deep questions we were led to ponder during the workshop.

This week is a kind of fall "triduum" – All Hollows' Eve, All Saints' Day, and All Souls' Day. At assembly today, we talked about what each of these days celebrates, doing a short refresher on the "4 Last Things" and Purgatory. I also reminded the students that this Friday is a holy day of obligation. We then transitioned to a short initial reflection on the virtue of meekness, which is the moderation of anger according to right reason, which is part of the virtue of temperance. We discussed what it means to "moderate" our passions and how this is something we need to do in order to live a strong and holy life. Far from making us weak, meekness gives us strength to pursue what is good and just according to the truth. In coming weeks, we will be exploring this virtue more and its connection the overall virtue for the year, hope.
