From the Headmaster

We begin our Scholastica Term with a bang, celebrating the traditional date of Epiphany – January 6th. After counting the 12 days of Christmas, we enter the season of Epiphany, which carries on the Christmas season until Candlemas on February 2nd. As we reviewed at assembly, this feast combines three events in Christ's life: the adoration of the Magi, the baptism, and the wedding feast at Cana. Each one reveals Christ's divinity – in the gifts the Magi presented, in the descent of the dove and the Father's voice at the baptism, and in Christ's first miracle at Cana.

As you may have noticed, I added some upcoming events to our newsletter calendar list. Our annual Trivia Night on February 22nd (specific times TBA) will be a fun opportunity to have a night out and support the school. I had a lot of fun with my wife at last year's event!

I am excited to host Dale Ahlquist, celebrated author and speaker and, in Joseph Pearce's estimation, "the greatest living authority" on G.K. Chesterton's life and work. Ahlquist co-founded the first Chesterton Academy, a classical high school in Minnesota, which is the flagship school of the Chesterton Schools Network. Mr. Ahlquist will be speaking on "How to Create Complete Thinkers" at 7 p.m. in the school gym on Thursday, March 20th. This will be another great opportunity for parents to deepen their knowledge of classical education.

Finally, please make special note of the Gala on April 5th. This is the school's most important fundraiser. This year, we are hoping to draw in more folks both from the school and parish communities, so thank you in advance for your support and efforts to spread the word. Save-the-dates have already gone out. Tickets will be available beginning on February 5th, just under a month away!
