From the Headmaster

During Scholastica Term, we will be focusing on the virtue of obedience – every parent's favorite! At assembly, I talked about Christ's obedience in the Holy Family, which serves as a model for all of us and challenges us. If the King of the Universe could subject Himself to His own creatures, surely we can learn to obey God and those He places over us!

To us modern Americans, "obedience" can sometimes have a harsh overtone, as demanding our submission and compliance to things we otherwise wouldn't do. In the Catholic tradition, however, it is a much deeper and richer thing than that. In fact, obedience is of fundamental importance in living the Christian life. As I pointed out to the students, we are all lovers of our own wills, and it can be very difficult to submit to the will of another. On the other hand, as we often learn when we get older and gain life experience, it can be a great relief just to follow another's will, to be the receiver of directions rather than the giver. It is a scary and dangerous thing to have to be guided simply by our own will, and we know that this is typically a recipe for falling into sin. As we continue to look at obedience, we will be viewing it in connection to humility and love and submitting to Christ's "sweet yoke."
